Using objects to engage your learners

Object-based learning (OBL)

Object Based Learning is a student-centered learning approach that uses objects to inspire deep learning.


Objects are brought into the learning environment for small group teaching or large group lectures.

The use of objects can act as multi-sensory "thinking tools" to promote learning and engagement.

- Objects are not age-specific not tied to a particular grade level
- Objects help us document the history of life and culture
- Using objects helps students develop important intellectual skills

Teaching with primary source documents

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These are original documents with firsthand evidence.

Primary sources include original documents such as diaries, speeches, manuscripts, letters, interviews, records, eyewitness accounts, autobiographies.
